Hence, the first question is: Would DRK consider a modular proposal with an option for additional LoE so that questions of the type "what works" can be answered more robustly?	Yes, we can consider a modular proposal but within the overall timeframe and range mentioned in the terms of reference (40-45 days, submission no later than 15 <sup>th</sup> November).
